

TEHILLIM TALKS

Psalm 37

Of David.

1-6

[8] Fret not yourself because of evildoers, nor be envious of wrongdoers.² For they will soon wither like the grass and fade like the green herb.³ [2] Trust in Adonai, and do good. Dwell on the earth and shepherd faith.⁴ [3] Delight yourself in Adonai, and He will give you the desires of your heart.⁵ Turn over your path to Adonai; trust in Him, and He will act.⁶ He will lead forth your righteousness as the light, and your justice as the noonday.

7-11

[7] Be silent before Adonai **and wait with longing** for Him; fret not yourself over the one who prospers in his way, over the man who carries out evil schemes. ⁸ [7] Let go of anger, and forsake wrath. Fret not yourself; it tends only to evil. ⁹ For evildoers will be cut off, but those who hope in Adonai <u>shall inherit the earth</u>. ¹⁰ [1] In just a little while, the wicked will be no more. You will look carefully at his place – he will not be there. ¹¹ But the humble/afflicted <u>shall inherit the earth</u> and delight themselves in abundant peace.

12-15

[1] The wicked plots against the righteous and gnashes his teeth at him, ¹³ but the Master laughs at him, for He sees that his day is coming. ¹⁴ [I] The wicked draw the sword and bend their bows to bring down the poor and needy, to slay those whose way is upright. ¹⁵ Their sword shall enter their own heart, and their bows shall be broken.

16-22

[1] Better is the little that the righteous has than the noisy abundance of many wicked. ¹⁷ For the arms of the wicked shall be broken, but Adonai upholds the righteous. ¹⁸ [1] Adonai knows the days of the blameless, and their heritage will remain forever. ¹⁹ They will not be ashamed in the time of evil, and in the days of famine they have abundance. ²⁰ [2] But the wicked shall perish, and the enemies of Adonai, like the fat of rams, vanish – like smoke they vanish away. ²¹ [⁴] The wicked borrows but does not repay, but the righteous is generous and gives. ²² For those He blesses shall inherit the earth, but those He curses shall be cut off.

23-26

[2] The steps of a man are established by Adonai, when He delights in his way. ²⁴ Though he fall, he shall not be cast down, for Adonai upholds his hand. ²⁵ [2] I have been young, and now am old, yet I have not seen a righteous man forsaken or his children begging for bread. ²⁶ He is ever lending generously, and his seed become a blessing.

27-34

[D] Turn away from evil and do good and so shall you dwell forever. -[y]?-²⁸ For Adonai loves justice and He will not forsake his holy ones. They are guarded forever, but the seed of the wicked shall be cut off.²⁹ The righteous shall <u>inherit the earth</u> and dwell upon it forever.³⁰ [D] The mouth of the righteous man utters/meditates wisdom, and his tongue speaks justice.³¹ God's Torah is in his heart – his steps do not slip.
³² [Y] The wicked watches the righteous man and seeks to put him to death.³³ Adonai will not abandon him to his power or let him be condemned when he is judged.³⁴ [7] Hope for Adonai and keep His way, and He will exalt you to <u>inherit the earth</u>; you will see the wicked cut off.

35-40

[7] I have seen a wicked, ruthless man spreading himself like a green laurel tree. ³⁶ But he passed away, and behold, he was no more. Though I sought him, he could not be found. ³⁷ [v] Watch the blameless, behold the upright, for the man of peace has a future. ³⁸ But transgressors shall be altogether destroyed, the future of the wicked shall be cut off. ³⁹ [π] The rescue of the righteous is from Adonai, their stronghold in time of distress.

⁴⁰ Adonai helps them and frees them,

He rescues them from the wicked and saves them, because they take refuge in Him.

Verses 1,7,8

Proverbs 24:19-20 Do not fret (אל תתחר), *al tit'char*) yourself because of evildoers, and do not be envious of the wicked, for the evil man has no future. The lamp of the wicked will be put out.

Verse 5

1 Peter 5:6-7 Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time He may exalt you, casting all your anxieties on Him, because He cares for you.
