THE HEBREW KEY #20 – "The Foolishness of God"

1 Corinthians 1:23-25

But we proclaim Messiah crucified – a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles – but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Messiah the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the **foolishness** of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men.



Deuteronomy 21:22-23

"And if a man has committed a crime punishable by death and he is put to death, and you hang him on a tree, his **corpse** shall not remain all night on the tree, but you shall bury him the same day, <u>for a hanged man is a curse of God</u>. You shall not defile your land that Adonai your God is giving you for an inheritance."

"foolishness" = נבלה = "corpse"

1 Corinthians 1:23-25

But we proclaim Messiah crucified ... For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men.

Galatians 3:13

Messiah redeemed us from the curse of the Torah by becoming a curse for us – for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who is **hanged** on a tree".

κρεμάννυμι (*kremannumi*)

Matthew 22:37-40

And He said to him, "You shall **love the Lord your God** with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And the second is like it: You shall **love your neighbor** as yourself. On these two commandments **hang** all the Torah and the Prophets."

John 1:14

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

REFERENCES:

1Samuel 25:25 "Let not my lord regard this worthless fellow, <u>Naval</u> (נבל), for as his name is, so is he. Naval (נבל) is his name, and <u>folly</u> (נבלה) is with him..."

Genesis 34:7 The sons of Jacob had come in from the field as soon as they heard of it, and the men were indignant and very angry, because [Shechem] had done <u>a foolish thing</u> (נבלה, *ne'valah*) in Israel by lying with Jacob's daughter, for such a thing must not be done. (1st app.)

Isaiah 9:17 ... and every mouth speaks <u>folly</u> (נבלה, *ne'valah*).

Leviticus 17:15 And every person who eats a <u>carcass</u> (גבלה, *ne'veilah*) or what is torn by beasts, whether he is a native or a sojourner, shall wash his clothes and bathe himself in water and be unclean until the evening; then he shall be clean.
