Psalm 49

To the choirmaster. A Psalm of the Sons of Korah.

1-4

Hear this, all peoples! Give ear, all inhabitants of the **world** – ² you sons of Adam, you sons of man, together rich and poor!

חלד (*cheled*) "world / mole"

- ³ My mouth speaks wisdom...
- ... the meditation of my heart understanding.
- ⁴ I incline my ear to a **proverb** ...

... I will reveal my **riddle** with the lyre.

משל (*mashal*) "proverb / parable" "allegory"

חירה (*chidah*) "figure / riddle"

5-13

Why should I fear in evil days, when crime comes round me at my heels? ⁶ Those who trust in their wealth and boast of the abundance of their riches [are the ones who should be in fear]. ⁷ Surely they can redeem no man, or give to God his ransom. ⁸ For to redeem their life is too costly and can never suffice. ⁹ Will he yet live forever and not see the pit? ¹⁰ For he sees the wise die. The fool and the brutish alike must perish and abandon their wealth to others. ¹¹ Their grave is their home forever, their dwelling for all generations, though their names had been called on earth. ¹² Man in his pomp will not "spend the night". He is like the beasts that perish. ¹³ This is the way of the fool. Yet their followers approve of what they say! *Selah*

לין (leen)

14-15

Like sheep they are appointed for *sheol;* death shall shepherd them, and the upright shall rule over them in the morning. Their image shall be worn out in *sheol*, with no place to dwell. ¹⁵ But God will ransom my soul from the hand of *sheol*, for He will receive me. *Selah*

16-20

Be not afraid when a man becomes rich, when the glory of his house increases. ¹⁷ For when he dies he will carry nothing away; his glory will not go down after him. ¹⁸ For though, while he lives, he counts himself blessed – and though you get praise when you do well for yourself – ¹⁹ his soul will go to the generation of his fathers, who will never again see light. ²⁰ Man in his pomp, when he does not discern, is like the beasts that perish.

REFERENCES:

Verse 1

Leviticus 11:29 "Now these are to you the unclean among the swarming things which swarm on the earth: the <u>mole</u> (חלד, *choled*), and the mouse, and the great lizard in its kinds."

Verse 4

Proverbs 1:6 To understand a <u>proverb</u> (משל, mashal) and a saying, the words of the wise and their <u>riddles</u> (חירה, *chidah*).

Numbers 12:8 "With [Moses] I speak mouth to mouth, clearly, and not in <u>riddles</u> (חירה, *chidah*), and he beholds the form of Adonai..."

Verse 7

Exodus 21:30 If a <u>ransom</u> is imposed on him, then he shall give for the <u>redemption</u> of his life whatever is imposed on him.

Verse 12

Genesis 19:2 And he said, "My lords, please turn aside to your servant's house and <u>spend the night</u> (לִייְ, *leen*) and wash your feet. Then you may rise up early and go on your way." They said, "No; we will <u>spend the night</u> (לִייָ, (*leen*) in the town square." (1st app.)

Verse 13

Luke 12:20 "But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul is required of you, and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?"

Verse 14

Genesis 18:12 So Sarah laughed to herself, saying, "After I am <u>worn out</u> (בלֹה, *balah*), and my lord is old, shall I have pleasure?" (1st app.)

Deuteronomy 8:4 Your clothing did not <u>wear out</u> (בלה, *balah*) on you and your foot did not swell these forty years. (2nd app.)
